# Polarising

**Meaning:** Causing division or sharp contrasts between groups.

# Disenchantment

# Fray

**Meaning** : To control or guide something.

**Synonyms** : **Restrain, manage.**

**Antonyms** : **Release, neglect.**

The CEO had to rein in unnecessary expenditures to stabilize the company.

# Impeach

**Meaning** : To charge a public official with misconduct.

**Synonyms** : Accuse, indict.

**Antonyms** : Exonerate, absolve.

**Example** :

The parliament moved to impeach the official for corruption allegations.

# Trifecta

**Meaning** : A set of three wins or successes.

**Synonyms** : Hat-trick, triad.

**Antonyms** : Failure, single.

**Example** :

Winning the elections, passing the budget, and reducing inflation marked the trifecta of achievements.



# Rankle

**Meaning** : To cause persistent annoyance or resentment.

**Synonyms** : Irritate, vex.

**Antonyms** : Comfort, soothe.

**Example** :

The unfair criticism continued to rankle the author for months.

# Mobilisation

**Meaning** : Preparing resources or people for action, often in a coordinated way.

**Synonyms** : Deployment, assembly.

**Antonyms** : Disbandment, disorganization.

**Example** :

The mobilisation of volunteers during the crisis was commendable.

# Plaudits

**Meaning** : Praise or applause.

**Synonyms** : Acclaim, commendation.

**Antonyms** : Criticism, disapproval.

**Example** :

The scientist received plaudits for her groundbreaking research.
