# Proliferate

**Meaning:** To increase rapidly in numbers or spread extensively.

## Amend

**Meaning:** To make changes to improve or correct something.

# Adversarial

**Meaning:** Involving opposition or conflict.

# Resilient

# Abrogate

**Meaning:** To formally abolish or annul.

# Stymie

**Meaning:** To prevent or hinder progress.

**Synonyms:** Block, impede, thwart.

**Antonyms:** Facilitate, assist, support.

**Example:**

The heavy rains stymied the rescue efforts in the region.

## Expansive

**Meaning:** Extensive or covering a wide area.

**Synonyms:** Broad, wide-ranging, comprehensive.

**Antonyms:** Narrow, limited, restricted.

**Example:**

The expansive view from the hilltop took everyone's breath away.



# Plaudit

**Meaning:** Praise or approval.

**Synonyms:** Applause, acclaim, commendation.

**Antonyms:** Criticism, disapproval, condemnation.

**Example:**

The artist received plaudits for her innovative sculptures.

# Disenchantment

**Meaning:** A feeling of disappointment or loss of belief.

**Synonyms:** Disillusionment, dissatisfaction, cynicism.

**Antonyms:** Enthusiasm, belief, confidence.

# Cohesion

**Meaning:** The action or fact of forming a united whole.

**Synonyms:** Unity, togetherness, solidarity.

**Antonyms:** Division, discord, fragmentation.

The team's cohesion was vital to their championship success.
