



# **Ambivalence**

Meaning: Mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something.

Synonyms: Uncertainty, indecision.

Antonyms: Certainty, clarity.

#### Example:

The government's ambivalence on climate policy has drawn criticism.



# Resilience

Meaning: The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties.

Synonyms: Fortitude, adaptability.

Antonyms: Fragility, vulnerability.

### Example:

The resilience of communities affected by the cyclone was commendable.



# **Exacerbate**

Meaning: To make a problem or situation worse.

Synonyms: Aggravate, intensify.

Antonyms: Alleviate, reduce.

### Example:

Poor infrastructure exacerbates the effects of heavy rainfall.



# **Pragmatic**

Meaning: Dealing with things sensibly and realistically.

Synonyms: Practical, logical.

Antonyms: Idealistic, unrealistic.

### Example:

A pragmatic approach is necessary to resolve urban issues.



# Impediment

Meaning: A hindrance or obstruction.

Synonyms: Barrier, obstacle.

Antonyms: Facilitation, support.

### Example:

Corruption remains a significant impediment to development.



# **Proliferation**

Meaning: Rapid increase in numbers.

Synonyms: Growth, spread.

Antonyms: Reduction, decline.

### Example:

The proliferation of fake news on social media is alarming.



# Mitigate

*Meaning*: To make less severe or serious.

Synonyms: Alleviate, ease.

Antonyms: Worsen, intensify.

#### Example:

Measures were taken to mitigate the impact of the cyclone.



# Autonomy

*Meaning*: The right or condition of self-government.

Synonyms: Independence, self-rule.

Antonyms: Dependence, subjugation.

#### Example:

Granting autonomy to local bodies can enhance governance.



# Consensus

*Meaning*: General agreement.

Synonyms: Accord, unanimity.

Antonyms: Disagreement, discord.

### Example:

Building consensus on the new policy was challenging.



# **Erosion**

Meaning: Gradual destruction or reduction of something.

Synonyms: Degradation, decay.

Antonyms: Preservation, strengthening.

#### Example:

The erosion of trust in public institutions is concerning.
