



Arduous

Meaning: Requiring great effort; laborious.

Synonyms: Strenuous, tough, grueling.

Antonyms: Easy, effortless.

Example:

Preparing for the UPSC exam is an arduous journey that requires perseverance.



Revamp

Meaning: To make changes to improve or modernize.

Synonyms: Renovate, overhaul, remodel.

Antonyms: Deteriorate, ruin.

Example:

The government plans to revamp the tax structure to make it more efficient.



Acrimonious

Meaning: Filled with bitterness or resentment.

Synonyms: Hostile, bitter, contentious.

Antonyms: Harmonious, amicable.

Example:

The debate between the two leaders turned acrimonious quickly.



Feasibility

Meaning: The practicality or possibility of something being achieved.

Synonyms: Viability, practicality, achievability.

Antonyms: Impracticality, infeasibility.

Example:

The feasibility of implementing the project within the budget is being analyzed.



Amenable

Meaning: Open and responsive to suggestions; cooperative.

Synonyms: Compliant, agreeable, responsive.

Antonyms: Stubborn, uncooperative.

Example:

The minister was amenable to the committee's recommendations.



Spectre

Meaning: A looming or potential threat.

Synonyms: Ghost, shadow, menace.

Antonyms: Assurance, certainty.

Example:

The spectre of inflation worries economists across the globe.



Instructive

Meaning: Providing useful information or insight.

Synonyms: Educational, enlightening, informative.

Antonyms: Misleading, unhelpful.

Example:

The session on climate change was highly instructive for the attendees.



Obscure

Meaning: Not clear or easily understood; not well known.

Synonyms: Ambiguous, vague, unclear.

Antonyms: Clear, obvious, well-known.

Example:

His reference to an obscure historical event confused the audience.

Meaning: Lacking grace in movement or posture.

Synonyms: Awkward, clumsy, inelegant.

Antonyms: Graceful, elegant.

Example:

The dancer's movements appeared ungainly due to his injury.



Aversion

Meaning: A strong dislike or disinclination.

Synonyms: Reluctance, antipathy, loathing.

Antonyms: Liking, affection, fondness.

Example:

She has a deep aversion to dishonesty in any form.
