



Polemic

Meaning: A strong verbal or written attack on someone or something.

Synonyms: Controversy, argument, diatribe.

Antonyms: Agreement, harmony, conciliation.

Example:

The editorial's polemic against political corruption resonated with readers.



Proclivity

Meaning: A natural tendency to behave in a particular way.

Synonyms: Inclination, propensity, penchant.

Antonyms: Aversion, disinclination, dislike.

Example:

She has a proclivity for innovative solutions in crisis management.



Lugubrious

Meaning: Looking or sounding sad and dismal.

Synonyms: Mournful, gloomy, melancholy.

Antonyms: Cheerful, joyful, elated.

Example:

The lugubrious tone of the article highlighted the grim realities of climate change.



Venerate

Meaning: Regard with great respect.

Synonyms: Revere, worship, honor.

Antonyms: Desecrate, defame, denigrate.

Example:

The editorial venerates the leaders who contributed to the freedom struggle.



Obfuscate

Meaning: To make something unclear or obscure.

Synonyms: Confuse, cloud, complicate.

Antonyms: Clarify, elucidate, simplify.

Example:

The politician attempted to obfuscate the details of the controversial policy.



Ebullient

Meaning: Cheerful and full of energy.

Synonyms: Exuberant, lively, enthusiastic.

Antonyms: Depressed, apathetic, subdued.

Example:

The article described the ebullient celebrations after the sports victory.



Intransigent

Meaning: Unwilling to change one's views or to agree.

Synonyms: Stubborn, uncompromising, obstinate.

Antonyms: Flexible, compliant, amenable.

Example:

The intransigent stance of both parties led to a stalemate in negotiations.



Evanescent

Meaning: Quickly fading or disappearing.

Synonyms: Fleeting, ephemeral, transient.

Antonyms: Permanent, enduring, lasting.

Example:

The editor noted the evanescent interest in long-term environmental policies.

Effrontery

Meaning: Insolent or impertinent behavior.

Synonyms: Audacity, impudence, boldness.

Antonyms: Modesty, politeness, respect.

Example:

The columnist criticized the effrontery of ignoring public welfare demands.



Bucolic

Meaning: Relating to the pleasant aspects of the countryside and country life.

Synonyms: Pastoral, rustic, rural.

Antonyms: Urban, metropolitan, industrial.

Example:

The editorial painted a bucolic picture of India's agrarian villages.
