# Protract

**Meaning:** To prolong or extend in time.

# Impunity

**Meaning:** Exemption from punishment or loss.

**Synonyms:** Immunity, exemption, freedom.

# Tenacious

**Meaning:** Persistent, determined, or stubborn.

# Skepticism

**Meaning:** Doubt or questioning attitude.

## Expedite

**Meaning:** To speed up the progress of something.

**Synonyms:** Accelerate, hasten, quicken.

**Antonyms:** Delay, hinder, slow down.

**Example:**

The government promised to expedite the construction of roads.

# Subjugate

**Meaning:** To bring under domination or control.

**Synonyms:** Conquer, suppress, dominate.

**Antonyms:** Liberate, emancipate, free.

**Example:**

The emperor sought to subjugate the neighboring kingdoms.

## Envisage

**Meaning:** To imagine or expect something as a possibility.

**Synonyms:** Imagine, envision, foresee.

**Antonyms:** Ignore, overlook.

**Example:**

The project leader envisaged a future where technology integrates seamlessly.



## Paradox

**Meaning:** A statement that seems contradictory but may reveal a truth.

**Synonyms:** Contradiction, enigma, anomaly.

**Antonyms:** Consistency, clarity.

**Example:**

The paradox of freedom is that it often comes with responsibility.

# Mitigate

**Meaning:** To make less severe or serious.

**Synonyms:** Alleviate, reduce, ease.

**Antonyms:** Aggravate, exacerbate, intensify.

**Example:**

Policies were introduced to mitigate the effects of climate change.

# Disparate

**Meaning:** Essentially different in kind; not allowing comparison.

**Synonyms:** Diverse, contrasting, distinct.

**Antonyms:** Similar, homogeneous, alike.

**Example:**

The coalition included people from disparate backgrounds.
