ANSWER WITH EXPLANATION

1. (c)

Explanation: Replace "however" with "but" to maintain proper conjunction usage. "However" cannot be used as a coordinating conjunction here.

2. (b)

Explanation: "Were" should be replaced with "was" because the subject "The Minister" is singular, and phrases like "along with" do not affect the subject-verb agreement.

3. (b)

Explanation: "Was" should be replaced with "were" because the verb agrees with the plural noun "students," which is closer to it.

4. (d)

Explanation: The sentence is correct; "Scarcely had...when" is the appropriate structure.

5. (b)

Explanation: Replace "to provide" with "to providing" as the verb "committed to" is followed by a gerund.

6. (b)

Explanation: Replace "has" with "have" because "players," which is plural, is the antecedent of "who."

7. (b)

Explanation: Replace "acts" with "acted" as "It is high time" requires the past subjunctive.

8. (b)

Explanation: Replace "were" with "was" because "Each" is singular.

9. (b)

Explanation: Replace "needs" with "need" because "issues" is plural.

10. (b)

Explanation: Replace "have" with "has" because the subject "The rise" is singular.

11. (b)

Explanation: Replace "than" with "to" as "senior" is followed by "to" in standard English usage.

12. (b)

Explanation: Replace "were" with "was" because the subject "The book" is singular.

13. (b)

Explanation: Replace "when" with "than" as "No sooner...than" is the correct correlative conjunction pair.

14. (a)

Explanation: Remove "of" after "Despite" as it is redundant.

15. (d)

Explanation: The sentence is correct; "data" can be treated as plural, and "were" is appropriate.
