Ease

Meaning : (Verb) To make less severe, relieve

Synonyms: alleviate, mitigate, reduce

Antonyms: aggravate, intensify

Example:

"The new policies aim to ease the burden on small businesses."

Liquidity

Meaning : (Noun) The availability of liquid assets to a market or company

Synonyms: cash, solvency

Antonyms: insolvency, illiquidity

Example:

"High liquidity allows for more flexibility in financial markets."

Czar

Meaning : -(Noun) A powerful ruler or leader

Synonyms: magnate, mogul, tycoon

Antonyms: peasant, subordinate

Example:

"The media often refers to the business czar as a pivotal figure in the industry."

Walk a tightrope

Meaning : (Phrase) To handle a situation with difficulty, where a slight error can lead to disastrous outcomes

Synonyms: balance act, precarious situation

Antonyms: easy task, straightforward

Example:

"The government is walking a tightrope with its policy decisions."

Slump

Meaning : (Noun) A sudden drop or decrease

Synonyms: drop, decline, dip

Antonyms: rise, surge

Example:

"The stock market witnessed a slump in trading volumes."

Constraint

Meaning : (Noun) A limitation or restriction

Synonyms: restriction, limitation, check

Antonyms: freedom, allowance

Example:

"Resource constraints forced the company to cut back its expansion plans."

Complacent

Meaning : (Adjective) Self-satisfied and unaware of potential dangers

Synonyms: self-satisfied, smug, unconcerned

Antonyms: concerned, worried, alert

Example:

"The team's complacent attitude was a factor in their unexpected defeat."

Ramp up

Meaning : (Phrasal verb) To increase or accelerate

Synonyms: increase, boost, escalate

Antonyms: reduce, decrease

Example:

"The government is planning to ramp up spending on infrastructure projects."

Persistent

Meaning : (Adjective) Continuing over a long period of time

Synonyms: continuous, unrelenting, unending

Antonyms: sporadic, intermittent

Example:

"The persistent drought has caused severe water shortages in the region."

One-off

Meaning : (Adjective) Unique, not to be repeated

Synonyms: unique, singular, distinct

Antonyms: regular, routine

Example:

"The event was a one-off experience that participants would not forget."
