



Gamut

Meaning: The complete range or scope of something.

Synonyms: Range, spectrum, extent.

Antonyms: Limitation, restriction.

Example:

The policy covers a broad gamut of environmental issues.



Profligacy

Meaning: Reckless extravagance or wastefulness in use of resources.

Synonyms: Extravagance, excess, wastefulness.

Antonyms: Frugality, prudence.

Example:

The company's financial profligacy led to its downfall.



Coterie

Meaning: A small, exclusive group of people with shared interests.

Synonyms: Clique, faction, circle.

Antonyms: Mass, multitude.

Example:

The decision was made by a coterie of influential leaders.



Impunity

Meaning: Exemption from punishment or freedom from the consequences of an action.

Synonyms: Immunity, exemption, pardon.

Antonyms: Accountability, liability.

Example:

Many officials acted with impunity during the regime.



Scourge

Meaning: A cause of great trouble or suffering.

Synonyms: Bane, affliction, plague.

Antonyms: Blessing, boon.

Example:

Corruption is the scourge of governance in many countries.



Inexorable

Meaning: Impossible to stop or prevent.

Synonyms: Relentless, unstoppable, inevitable.

Antonyms: Flexible, yielding.

Example:

The inexorable march of technology reshaped industries.



Egalitarian

Meaning: Believing in or based on the principle that all people are equal.

Synonyms: Equal, fair, democratic.

Antonyms: Elitist, hierarchical.

Example:

An egalitarian society ensures equal rights for all citizens.



Exhortation

Meaning: An address or communication urging someone to do something.

Synonyms: Encouragement, persuasion, urging.

Antonyms: Dissuasion, deterrence.

Example:

The leader's exhortation inspired the team to work harder.



Flummoxed

Meaning: Perplexed or confused.

Synonyms: Baffled, bewildered, puzzled.

Antonyms: Clarified, enlightened.

Example:

The students were flummoxed by the unexpected question.



Ostensible

Meaning: Appearing to be true but not necessarily so.

Synonyms: Apparent, superficial, supposed.

Antonyms: Genuine, real.

Example:

His ostensible reason for the trip was business.
