(a) Everyone should bring / (b) their own lunch / (c) to the picnic tomorrow. /

(a) The cost of living / (b) have increased significantly / (c) over the past decade. / (d) No error.

Question 15

(a) The politician, whom many consider / (b) as one of the most influential leaders, / (c) made a significant announcement today. / (d) No error.



ANSWER WITH EXPLANATION



1. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "Committee" is a collective noun and should be followed by "its" instead of "their."

2. Answer: (b)

Explanation: When "neither...nor" is used, the verb should agree with the noun closest to it. Here, "employees" is plural, so it should be "were" instead of "was."

3. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "Each" is singular, so it should be "has submitted" instead of "have submitted."



4. Answer: (c)

Explanation: "The number" is a singular subject, so it should be "is increasing" instead of "are increasing."

5. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "Who" refers to "authors," which is plural, so it should be "have gained" instead of "has gained."

6. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "Data" is a plural noun, so it should be "reveal" instead of "reveals."



7. Answer: (a)

Explanation: In conditional sentences expressing hypothetical situations, "were" should be used instead of "was."

8. Answer: (b)

Explanation: The phrase "along with her students" is parenthetical; the main subject "teacher" is singular, so it should be "is planning" instead of "are planning."

9. Answer: (a)

Explanation: "Despite" should be used without "of." The correct phrase is "Despite the heavy rain."



10. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "Board of directors" is a collective noun and should be treated as singular, so it should be "has announced" instead of "have announced."

11. Answer: (a)

Explanation: "More smarter" is redundant; it should be "smarter."

12. Answer: (c)

Explanation: The correct tense is "have reviewed" to indicate an action that will be completed in the future before another future action.



13. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "Everyone" is singular, so it should be "his or her own lunch" instead of "their own lunch."

14. Answer: (b)

Explanation: "The cost of living" is a singular subject, so it should be "has increased" instead of "have increased."

15. Answer: (b)

Explanation: The word "consider" does not require "as." The correct phrase is "whom many consider one of the most influential leaders."
