



Disparity

Meaning: A great difference.

Synonyms: Inequality, imbalance, discrepancy

Antonyms: Equality, parity, similarity

Example:

The economic policies have led to a widening disparity between the rich and the poor.



Nuance

Meaning: A subtle difference in or shade of meaning, expression, or sound.

Synonyms: Subtlety, shade, distinction

Antonyms: Obviousness, crudeness, simplicity

Example:

The diplomat carefully considered every nuance of the language used in the treaty.



Resilience

Meaning: The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties; toughness.

Synonyms: Fortitude, endurance, grit

Antonyms: Weakness, fragility, vulnerability

Example:

The economy showed remarkable resilience in the face of the global recession.



Ambiguity

Meaning: The quality of being open to more than one interpretation; inexactness.

Synonyms: Vagueness, obscurity, uncertainty

Antonyms: Clarity, precision, certainty

Example:

The ambiguity of the legal clause led to conflicting interpretations.



Pragmatic

Meaning: Dealing with things practically and realistically rather than theoretically.

Synonyms: Realistic, practical, sensible

Antonyms: Idealistic, impractical, theoretical

Example:

The government adopted a pragmatic approach to solving the economic crisis.



Inherent

Meaning: Existing in something as a permanent, essential, or characteristic attribute.

Synonyms: Intrinsic, innate, natural

Antonyms: Acquired, learned, extrinsic

Example:

Every human being has an inherent right to freedom.



Mitigate

Meaning: Make (something bad) less severe, serious, or painful.

Synonyms: Alleviate, reduce, lessen

Antonyms: Aggravate, increase, intensify

Example:

The government took steps to mitigate the impact of the drought.



Dichotomy

Meaning: A division or contrast between two things that are or are represented as being opposed or entirely different.

Synonyms: Contrast, division, separation

Antonyms: Similarity, unity, convergence

Example:

There is often a dichotomy between theory and practice.



Paradigm

Meaning: A typical example or pattern of something; a model.

Synonyms: Model, pattern, example

Antonyms: Anomaly, deviation, exception

Example:

The discovery of DNA marked a paradigm shift in biology.



Ubiquitous

Meaning: Present, appearing, or found everywhere.

Synonyms: Pervasive, universal, omnipresent

Antonyms: Rare, scarce, uncommon

Example:

The internet has become ubiquitous in modern society.
