Disparity

Meaning: A great difference.

Synonyms: **Inequality, imbalance, discrepancy**

Antonyms: **Equality, parity, similarity**

Example:

The economic policies have led to a widening disparity between the rich and the poor.

Nuance

Meaning: A subtle difference in or shade of meaning, expression, or sound.

Synonyms: **Subtlety, shade, distinction**

Antonyms: **Obviousness, crudeness, simplicity**

Example:

The diplomat carefully considered every nuance of the language used in the treaty.

Resilience

Meaning: The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties; toughness.

Synonyms: **Fortitude, endurance, grit**

Antonyms: **Weakness, fragility, vulnerability**

Example:

The economy showed remarkable resilience in the face of the global recession.

Ambiguity

Meaning: The quality of being open to more than one interpretation; inexactness.

Synonyms: **Vagueness, obscurity, uncertainty**

Antonyms: **Clarity, precision, certainty**

Example:

The ambiguity of the legal clause led to conflicting interpretations.

Pragmatic

Meaning: Dealing with things practically and realistically rather than theoretically.

Synonyms: **Realistic, practical, sensible**

Antonyms: **Idealistic, impractical, theoretical**

Example:

The government adopted a pragmatic approach to solving the economic crisis.

Inherent

Meaning: Existing in something as a permanent, essential, or characteristic attribute.

Synonyms: **Intrinsic, innate, natural**

Antonyms: **Acquired, learned, extrinsic**

Example:

Every human being has an inherent right to freedom.

Mitigate

Meaning: Make (something bad) less severe, serious, or painful.

Synonyms: **Alleviate, reduce, lessen**

Antonyms: **Aggravate, increase, intensify**

Example:

The government took steps to mitigate the impact of the drought.

Dichotomy

Meaning: A division or contrast between two things that are or are represented as being opposed or entirely different.

Synonyms: **Contrast, division, separation**

Antonyms: **Similarity, unity, convergence**

Example:

There is often a dichotomy between theory and practice.

Paradigm

Meaning: A typical example or pattern of something; a model.

Synonyms: **Model, pattern, example**

Antonyms: **Anomaly, deviation, exception**

Example:

The discovery of DNA marked a paradigm shift in biology.

Ubiquitous

Meaning: Present, appearing, or found everywhere.

Synonyms: **Pervasive, universal, omnipresent**

Antonyms: **Rare, scarce, uncommon**

Example:

The internet has become ubiquitous in modern society.
