## Inexorable (adjective)

**Meaning:** Impossible to stop or prevent; relentless.

**Synonyms:** *Unstoppable, unyielding, inevitable.*

**Antonyms:** *Flexible, lenient, yielding.*

**Example:**

The inexorable advance of technology has transformed every aspect of modern life.

## Benign (adjective)

**Meaning:** Gentle and kind; having a favorable or harmless effect.

**Synonyms:** *Benevolent, gentle, harmless.*

**Antonyms:** *Malignant, harmful, hostile.*

### **Example:**

The environmental policy aims to promote practices that are benign to the planet's natural resources.

# Remunerative (adjective)

**Meaning:** Financially rewarding; lucrative.

**Example:**

## Stalemate (noun)

**Meaning:** A situation in which no progress can be made; a deadlock.

**Synonyms:** *Deadlock, impasse, standstill.*

**Antonyms:** *Breakthrough, progress, advancement.*

**Example:**

The negotiations reached a stalemate, with neither side willing to compromise.

## Diversify (verb)

**Meaning:** To make or become more varied; to expand into new areas.

**Synonyms:** *Vary, expand, broaden.*

**Antonyms:** *Concentrate, narrow, specialize.*

### **Example:**

Farmers are encouraged to diversify their crops to reduce economic risks.

## Imperative (adjective)

**Meaning:** Of vital importance; crucial.

**Synonyms:** *Essential, urgent, necessary.*

**Antonyms:** *Optional, nonessential, voluntary.*

**Example:**

It is imperative to address climate change to ensure a sustainable future.

## Mitigate (verb)

**Meaning:** To make less severe, serious, or painful.

**Synonyms:** *Alleviate, reduce, diminish.*

**Antonyms:** *Aggravate, intensify, exacerbate.*

**Example:**

Effective policies are needed to mitigate the impacts of climate change on agriculture.



# Resilience (noun)

**Meaning:** The capacity to recover quickly from difficulties; toughness.

**Synonyms:** *Fortitude, adaptability, toughness.*

**Antonyms:** *Fragility, vulnerability, weakness.*

**Example:**

Building resilience in communities is essential to withstand natural disasters.

# Proliferation (noun)

**Meaning:** Rapid increase in numbers; a large number of something.

**Synonyms:** *Expansion, multiplication, spread.*

**Antonyms:** *Reduction, decline, decrease.*

**Example:**

The proliferation of digital technologies has changed the way we communicate.

## Equitable (adjective)

**Meaning:** Fair and impartial.

**Synonyms:** *Just, fair, unbiased.*

**Antonyms:** *Unfair, biased, inequitable.*

**Example:**

The government aims to provide equitable access to education for all citizens.
