Question 1.

Answer: (d) towards

Explanation: "Towards" indicates a movement or direction of focus. The sentence implies a change in emphasis *in the direction of* sustainable development. "Onto" implies a more abrupt shift, "at" indicates a point, and "in" indicates a state of being.

Question 2.

Answer: (b) Against

Explanation: "Against" is used here to indicate a contrasting or opposing circumstance. The summit was held *in the context of* (but in contrast to) rising global tensions. "With" would imply the tensions were a contributing factor, "on" is used for surfaces, and "at" indicates a point.

Question 3.

Answer: (a) to

Explanation: "Led to" indicates a result or consequence. The investigation

resulted in finding the network. "At" indicates a location, "into" suggests

penetration, and "with" suggests accompaniment.

Question 4.

Answer: (d) in

Explanation: "In" is used to indicate investment within a particular sector or area. The investment is within the field of renewable energy. "At" is for locations, "to" implies a recipient, and "on" is for surfaces.

Question 5.

Answer: (a) Despite

Explanation: "Despite" indicates a contrast or contradiction. The company maintained profitability *in spite of* the downturn. "During" indicates a time period, "because of" indicates a cause, and "due" requires "to."

Explanation: "Bring an end to" is an idiomatic expression meaning to stop

something. The agreement aims to stop the conflict.
