# Re-organisation (noun)

**Meaning:** The action or process of changing the way something is organized.

**Synonyms:** Restructuring, reordering, overhaul.

**Antonyms:** Disorganization, disorder, chaos.

**Example:**

The company's re-organisation aimed to improve efficiency and reduce costs.

## **Delimitation** (noun)

**Meaning:** The action of fixing the limits or boundaries of something.

**Synonyms:** Boundary-setting, demarcation, defining.

**Antonyms:** Expansion, enlargement, extension.

**Example:**

The delimitation of electoral constituencies is crucial for fair representation.

## Prerequisite (noun)

**Meaning:** Something that is required as a prior condition for something else to happen or exist.

**Synonyms:** Requirement, condition, necessity.

**Antonyms:** Option, choice, nonessential.

### **Example:**

Passing the entrance exam is a prerequisite for admission to the university.

## Undertaking (noun)

**Meaning:** A formal promise or guarantee to do something.

**Synonyms:** Commitment, pledge, promise.

**Antonyms:** Neglect, abandonment, refusal.

**Example:**

He gave an undertaking to complete the project by the agreed deadline.

## **Quota** (noun)

**Meaning:** A fixed share or portion that someone is officially allowed to have or do.

**Synonyms:** Share, allotment, portion.

**Antonyms:** Whole, total, excess.

### **Example:**

The government set a quota for the number of students admitted under the new policy.



# Urbanisation (noun)

**Meaning:** The process by which towns, cities, and other urban areas are formed and become larger as more people begin to live and work in these areas.

**Synonyms:** City development, suburbanization, industrialization.

**Antonyms:** Depopulation, ruralization, decay.

### **Example:**

Rapid urbanisation has led to significant changes in the country's demographic landscape.

## **Necessitate** (verb)

**Meaning:** To make something necessary or unavoidable.

**Synonyms:** Require, demand, compel.

**Antonyms:** Avoid, eliminate, exclude.

### **Example:**

The sudden change in weather necessitated a change in our travel plans.



# Obligation (noun)

**Meaning:** The state of being required to do something because of a law, rule, promise, etc.

**Synonyms:** Duty, responsibility, commitment.

**Antonyms:** Option, choice, freedom.

**Example:**

Citizens have an obligation to obey the laws of their country.

## **Apprehensive** (adjective)

**Meaning:** Feeling anxious or worried about something that may happen.

**Synonyms:** Anxious, worried, fearful.

**Antonyms:** Confident, calm, assured.

**Example:**

She was apprehensive about starting her new job.

## Cessation (noun)

**Meaning:** The process of ending or stopping something.

**Synonyms:** Termination, halt, discontinuation.

**Antonyms:** Beginning, start, continuation.

**Example:**

The cessation of hostilities was welcomed by all parties involved.
